- Securing the first positive European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) review in 2019 of the classification of a key herbicide essential to grapevine production.
- Ensuring the 2024 renewal of a major multisite fungicide critical to pome fruit cultivation, through the integration of risk mitigation measures into a new European Commission compendium.
- Achieving, in 2025, the first renewal of a classified fungicidal active substance under the "negligible exposure" criterion.

EUFG has also played a pivotal role in the societal debate on PFAS, particularly in clarifying the essential value of certain substances such as Fluoropolymers. Their advocacy helped avert a blanket ban that would have jeopardised critical sectors including green energy technologies, electric vehicles, microchips, green hydrogen, and medical devices. By moving the debate beyond dogma, EUFG helped regulators understand the nuanced balance between risk and societal benefit.

Society will tighten restrictions, regulators will raise the bar, and transparency will become nonnegotiable. In this environment, small or generalist consultancies will fall apart. The

future belongs to firms with the depth and credibility to deliver real impact."
